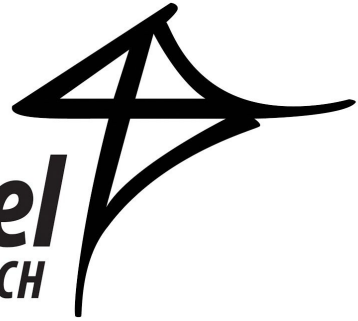

Share "Celebrations & Concerns" in Small Groups this Sunday!

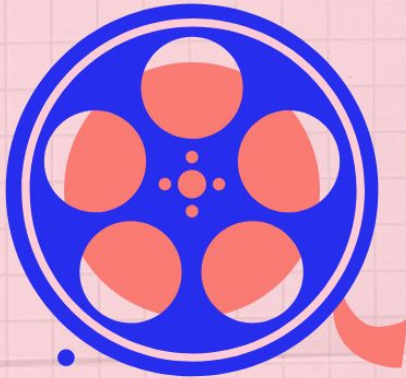

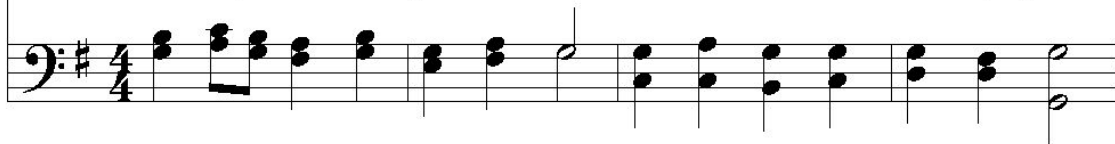

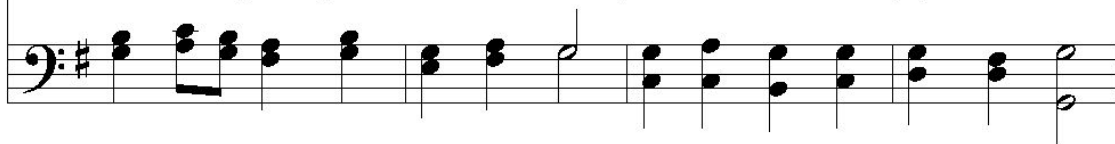
